
- To play the floor is lava

Reception

We can't believe it's half term already! What a busy half term this has been with the children starting their school journey.

This week we enjoyed a special afternoon for the whole school 'Geography Day'. We looked at Google Earth satellite maps and thought about the geographical features we could see – we found the UK and then Rackheath. We enjoyed looking at photos of things in Rackheath village – we spotted the church, the chip shop and many more! We then had great fun creating landmarks for our class map – we junk modelled shops, the school and the church.

In phonics, we have been busy learning u, b, f and e. These have been tricky to write. We have also been reading the tricky red words 'of', 'a' and 'said' – the children have been great at these!

In maths we loved reminding each other of the sayings for how to form the numbers, look out for these in your child's book bag after half term as we thought they might be useful at home too.


We have loved thinking about all things Autumn. The children really enjoyed exploring animals that are particularly active in this season – we found out that squirrels will find lots of foods to fill up their 'store cupboards' ready for winter. We were excited to find out about hibernation too. We are glad that hedgehogs have those spines to protect themselves from predators.

So, as you can see, we've been super busy and so we hope you all have a very fun but restful break too!









Year 1

Wow! What a fantastic first half term in Year 1! The children have all made such good progress over the last few weeks and have been able to recall facts about all our topic work – well done to all of them.

This week, we had the excitement of joining children from the other year groups, and for most of us working in a different classroom, for Geography Day. It was such a good day, with lots of good ideas for a new town / village and lots of crafting and making. Everyone had really good fun.

In Phonics, we finished recapping the sounds we already know, with 'ou' (shout it out) and 'oy' (toy for a boy). When we return to school, we will start learning new sounds and will be sending these home in Sound Pots for you to practise. In English, we continued with Little Red Riding Hood. We wrote letters to Little Red Riding Hood thanking her for helping people with their jobs, wrote instructions for staying safe in the woods, designed a new dessert to take to Granny and a new disguise for the wolf to wear. We have even been learning some songs to go with the story.

In Maths, we have been ordering numbers. We used Empty Number Lines to work out where numbers would go, using our knowledge of more than, less than, one more, one less. We also used the terms first, second, third and last.

We learnt about the Hindu festival of Diwali which will be taking place after half term. We shared the story of Rama and Sita and learnt how different people around the world celebrate. We made our own Rangoli patterns in chalk outside, coloured Rangoli patterns with crayons and made Diwali paper decorations. We also designed our Christmas cards this week ready to send home on Friday.

Year 2

What an amazing first few weeks the Year 2 children have had. It has been wonderful to share their learning journey, to see the progress that they have made and to see their wonderful characters emerge as they find their feet and feel more confident. In particular we have seen that the children are making superb progress with their independent writing, working hard to spell correctly. They have also shown us this week that they can remember many facts from our topic learning this Half Term.

This week the children have found fact families and number bonds to 100 in maths. We have also continued to practise counting in 2s and 5s which is something you can also do at home. In topic the children have made mini bug hotels and created food chains. On Tuesday the children enjoyed working in mixed age groups designing and creating a new town for our geography day. The children have undertaken writing tasks related to our lovely book "The Last Wolf", and we have revisited the long ee sound in phonics.

After Half Term we will have a week focussing on subtraction in maths. In topic we begin our history learning with finding out about Victorian seaside holidays.

Year 3

What a busy and brilliant last week of half term we have had in year 3! On Tuesday, we had Geography Day, where all of the children split up into different classes and designed a new town next to Rackheath. It was lovely to hear them all come back from their classes, enthusiastic and excited about their learning and to see their great ideas come to life on our zoom call in the afternoon.

Throughout the week in English, we have been continuing our instructional writing. The children have found features of a set of instructions; had a go at writing a method for 'How to Brush Your Teeth' and finished the week by creating a set of instructions for 'How to Carve a Pumpkin' in preparation for Halloween after half term! In Maths, the children have been working on adding and subtracting using our new and improved methods. After initially finding it a little tricky, the children have really picked it up and are making great progress!

Year 4

Year 4 have had another spectacular week this week. We have completed our free verse poetry unit today and the children have created some amazing final pieces about emotions!

In maths, we have finished our addition work and begun to look at subtraction. We will be continuing with this after half term just so that we feel really secure before we move onto multiplication and division.

Year 5

What a final week to the half term! We have now finished the Midnight Fox in English. We finished by writing a newspaper article about the Fox being saved and by writing a book review – one child said "it was one of the best books I have ever read!"

In maths, we have been using our adding and subtracting skills to solve word problems with money – it was interesting to see that lots of children didn't fully understand the concept of change as we don't use real money as much anymore.

The highlight of the week for science has to be our bug hunt! On Monday, we set traps and then collected them on Wednesday. We then used magnifying glasses and classification charts to try and identify the little creatures before they made daring escapes. Below are a few of the invertebrates that we found. Finally, I want to say a massive thank you to Mrs Coull for everything that she has done with the class. She has been a massive part of these children's lives for the past 5 years and I know that they have built up strong relationships with her. She will be really missed. From after half term, we will have Mrs Redgrave working in year 5 and I know that she will be a great addition to the team.









Year 6

What an amazing half term it has been! All of the Year 6s should be extremely proud of themselves for their excellent work rate, positive attitude to learning and perseverance throughout tricky tasks.

In Maths lessons this week, we tackled even more reasoning problems linked to addition and subtraction before moving onto successfully using short multiplication. I have been amazed at the effort that they have put into their writing too! At the beginning of the week, the children continued their understanding of non-chronological reports and planned their own versions linked to WW2. Once they decided on four main areas, the children researched key pieces of information before adding them to their own reports. Just some of the areas ranged from: weapons, influential figures, Axis and Allied Powers, rationing, evacuees, the Blitz and the Battle of Britain. Today, they were given a set of grammar challenge cards to complete and it was fantastic to see how much they could retain from previous lessons.

In Science lessons, we discussed germination and planned an experiment which will commence after half term. The children also demonstrated excellent subject knowledge where they could confidently discuss their understanding of vertebrates and invertebrates.

As well as nearly finishing their tessellating patterns in art, the Year 6s had a French lesson (focusing on colours) as well as additional History lessons linked to the Battle of Britain and the Blitz. A huge well done needs to go to the Year 5s and 6s who attended the cluster football tournament on Wednesday. One of the Rackheath teams managed to win the tournament and it was great to hear how well everyone played!
