


Friday 4th October 2024

Bombers

Hi to all our families from a very busy Bombers. The children have enjoyed many physical activities this week. Musical bumps and statues, action songs, hammering, tools in the dough, bead frames and connecting puzzles. There have been some lovely paintings, collage and sticker pictures.





Next week we are having the farm small world with soil and Harvest activities in the craft area. Our focus is communication and language with lots of songs, stories and turn taking games. We were thinking it would be nice to

take a fruit basket to Ashfields for Harvest so if anyone would like to donate a piece of fruit next week it would be appreciated. There will be a box in the lobby.

Reception

This week we have been continuing our topic 'All about Me' – the children have loved talking about their families, homes and busy lives. They have thought about and discussed what babies can/ can't do and how they have changed now that they're school age. We have looked at faces and thought about facial features and other body parts and what we might use them for ... the children have certainly put their arms and legs to great use since they've been here – outside, the tree, hammock and wild area ladder have all been hugely popular choices! In phonics, we have learnt the sounds t, i, n and p. We have been really busy practising forming these letters by writing large versions on our playground in chalk or searching for the different sounds in the rice tray! In maths, we have looked at the numbers 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9. Maybe this weekend, they could keep an eye out for sounds and numbers on road signs, etc. They may not know the larger numbers yet, e.g. 40 mph or 26 miles, but to recognise the single digits would be great! Similarly, they could spot digits on number plates/ front doors. Prompted by a child's question when reading one of our stories, we looked at the word 'absorb' – we tested some

materials to see if they were absorbent or not, made predictions and then explored ourselves in the water tray outside!

Have a lovely weekend all – we are looking forward to enjoying a popular folk tale with the class next week.









Year 1

Year 1 have had such an exciting week! We absolutely loved our trip to Norwich Castle Museum. Everyone was so engaged and enthusiastic and really enjoyed designing their own magical creature. We also had time to explore the rest of the museum.

In Phonics, we have practised the sounds 'oo' (poo at the zoo) and 'oo' (look at a book). In English, we read some information about catapults together and labelled some medieval weapons. Austin made his own catapult in playing time! We wrote recounts of our trip using the photos from the day to help us.

In Maths, we continued with our work on greater than (>), less than (<) and equal to (=). We practised using number lines and number cards to order numbers.







Year 2

We have had a wonderful week of learning and adventure!

On Tuesday, we went on a fantastic trip to Norwich Castle. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the castle and they were fascinated by the various Roman and Ancient Egyptian artefacts. One of the highlights was the magical creature's workshop, where they invented their own hybrid creatures – like the creative 'dogapillar' (a mix of a dog and a caterpillar)! During our visit, we spotted a knight's suit of armour. This inspired our Topic lesson on Thursday where we learnt about the life of a knight and labelled the different parts of a knight's suit of armour.





In English, we began working on writing a recount of our trip to Norwich Castle. The children have been focusing on writing in the

first person and using co-ordinating (and, but, or) and time (first, next, after that) conjunctions to enhance their writing.

In Maths, we kicked off our addition and subtraction unit. The children have made a fantastic start, demonstrating a strong understanding of bonds to 10 and 100, as well as practicing writing addition and subtraction fact families and finding 1 more and 1 less from numbers up to 100.

Year 3

We have had another brilliant, busy week, full of learning in Year 3!

In English, we have been looking at how to write a setting description. To begin the week, we focused our learning on our five senses linked to the rainforest. We then moved on to learning skills including expanded noun phrases and figurative language such as personification and similes. We will continue to develop these skills next week ready to write some wonderful setting descriptions about the Amazon Rainforest.

In Maths, we began our next unit, addition and subtraction. This week we have learned about using our number bond knowledge to add and subtract ones, tens and hundreds. So far, the children have been very successful with this new learning.

In Topic, we learned about the importance of trade for the Roman Empire and the significant factors of settlements in Roman Britain. We learnt that Roman Britain towns had different names to our cities today - with cities such as London known as Londinium and Colchester known as Camulodunum. In addition to this, we identified that Roman settlements were located near to the sea for the purpose of transporting goods (trade).



In Music, we continued work around the song 'Let Your Spirit Fly'. This week we practised singing the song alongside playing the glockenspiel in time with the tune. We are getting very good at playing the glockenspiels now - take a look at the class in action!



In Art, we continued looking at artwork created by the French post-impressionist, Henri Rousseau. This week we explored and analysed his oil paintings in greater depth, ready to plan and produce our own paintings in the coming weeks.

Year 4

We have had another wonderful week in Year 4! We have continued to work on the expectations of being in Year 4 and we are showing just how grown up we can be by earning enough class points for a reward.

In English we have continued our work into deforestation looking at the for and against in more detail. Despite their own individual beliefs everyone has been able to explain both viewpoints. After carefully planning and sharing of ideas, they loved expressing their knowledge during a debate with a partner. We finished the week by creating posters to persuade others of our viewpoint linked to the topic.



In Maths we completed our unit on place value by looking at rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. On Friday we began our addition and subtraction unit by completing lots of number sentences using counters to support or our work.

In topic the children have enjoyed linking our geography to the Roman Empire. We have learnt all about trade and begun to explore how, what, and why questions linked to the Romans and their trade!



Year 5

In maths this week we have moved on to looking at formal addition – using the method that I modelled during our recent parent café morning! I am really impressed with how quickly the children have grasped this new method...it shows that the work in year 4 helped to secure their understanding.

In English, we have just found out that the Midnight Fox has a cub...but Uncle Fred wants to go hunting for it! Our work has focussed on letter writing as we are trying to convince Uncle Fred not to kill the fox and its cub.

In Science, we have continued our work on the properties of materials by trying to keep an ice cube frozen. To do this, the children conducted an experiment by picking three materials to wrap the ice cubes in. In the pictures below, you can see ice cubes wrapped in in Clingfilm, clay and a leaf! We found out that aluminium foil was the best insulator!

In history, our focus has been on the journey from Europe to England...we used poetry to try and get a sense of how that may have felt for the families involved during Anglo Saxon times. We have also been preparing for our assembly next Wednesday at 2.30pm. We hope to see as many of you there as possible.







Year 6

It's great to be back from my paternity leave and the children have continued to work hard in all lessons this week.

Firstly, it was brilliant to see so many parents and family members today for our Year 6 Welcome Café. This began by discussing the key events throughout Year 6, information linked to Aylmerton and designing some Halloween crafts in preparation for some spooky story writing later this half term. **If you were unable to attend today, the Aylmerton kit list letter has been sent home.** Further information will hopefully be sent out via Ping by the end of next week.

In Maths, we have looked at rounding decimal numbers as well as answering a variety of questions linked to positive and negative numbers.

For Literacy, the children completed a series of grammar activities and finished their non-chronological reports based on the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. We also began writing an informal letter to a friend to explain what life is like in Afghanistan – to tie in with our class book 'Boy Overboard'.

During Science lessons, we learnt about the three states of matter: solids, liquids and gases, and explained the properties of each. In Topic, we learnt more about the life of Anglo-Saxons and Vikings before researching Viking Longships.







Well done to Reception and Year 6 who had 99% attendance last week. Attendance Bear will share next week with them.
